Site:	Truro
Time:	Midday-4pm
Weather:	Slightly overcast with frequent heavy showers.
Situation:	Outside Tesco's entrance, riverside, next to covered walkway close to cashpoint machine.
Councillor Assistance:	CLlr Ellis, Desmond and MacKenzie. CLlr Ellis set up & dismantled the trailer.
Comment:	Most people were on a mission (to shop) but were happy to take a leaflet to explore the idea.

Taken away by the public:	450
Taken away:	0
Busiest time:	Midday – 3.30
Refusing to discuss:	1 (Note: not just busy and keeping walking, but against the idea)
Common themes:	Ranked in order of frequency: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Cornwall Council haven't & won't listen 2. A need to preserve greenfield sites
Opinion:	It was a good place to build awareness. People had come to shop & did not have time to stop, but welcomed a short conversation to understand the leaflet they were taking away. At least a third said they knew others who would be interested too. Three people mentioned they had been talking about it this week so were glad of the opportunity. It's clear the Localism Act has provided an anti-apathy tool. At first people firmly believe they will not be listened to. After repeating the nature of the consultation and the feature of the Localism Act, they become inspired and keenly grasp the challenge.
