<b>Date:</b>	Friday 28th September
<b>Site:</b>	Truro
<b>Time:</b>	9.30am-1.30pm
<b>Weather:</b>	Sunny.
<b>Situation:</b>	Trailer was in the shade outside the Hall for Cornwall, 30 yards from the Food Festival Tent.
<b>Councillor Assistance:</b>	Cllr Ellis. Cllrs Biscoe and MacKenzie also attended. Cllr Ellis set up & dismantled the trailer. Roger Gazzard & Ian Hibberd also attended.
<b>Comment:</b>	It was a great day for discussing the issue, people were in Truro roaming because they wanted to and were interested in what was on the Piazza.

<b>Taken away by the public:</b>	100
<b>Taken away:</b>	0
<b>Busiest time:</b>	Constant
<b>Refusing to discuss:</b>	0 (Note: not just busy and keeping walking, but against the idea)
<b>Common themes:</b>	Ranked in order of frequency: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Embracing and maintaining the spirit of the city centre</li> <li>2. Preserving greenfield and current landscape</li> </ul>
<b>Opinion:</b>	It was a fantastic venue, with attitudes made positive by the atmosphere on the piazza and the Food Festival.  The morning was very different as in quality conversations were had, focused replies on the forms and takeaway messages to ask others to take part were taken on board.  The trailer could have managed operating for longer as quality conversations were had and forms filled at good pace and rate of 1 in 5, by one person manning the trailer through the majority of the time there ( <i>the trailer did not operate in the afternoon due to a council meeting</i> ).
